




Population in million




Income levels (Rs)



Motor vehicles (In Thousands)



- A Safe System's approach to road safety
- Political will
- Lead agency for road safety
- Implementation of effective interventions
 - Legislation, enforcement, social marketing
 - Safe infrastructure



Political will





Lead agencies on road safety

- USA: National Highway Traffic Safety Authority
- France: Inter-ministerial Road Safety Committee (within Ministry of Transport)
- Sweden: Swedish Road Authority
- Spain: Inter-ministerial Road Safety Committee (within Ministry of Interior)
- Brazil: DENATRAN (within Ministry of Transport)
- New Zealand: Land Transport Authority

Legislation



- Evidence based legislation
- Enforcement:
 - Visible policing
 - Appropriate penalties
 - High perceived levels of enforcement



Costs and benefits



Road traffic injuries cost countries approx 1 to 3% GDP

- Seatbelts (USA, Canada, Norway): 1 : 3-8
- Speed cameras (all EU): 1 : 5.9
- Motorcycle helmets (Norway, USA): 1 : 17
- Drinking and driving: 1 : 19-56
- Rumble strips (Norway): 1: 182




